The Misuse of Drugs Act 1971 (Ketamine etc) (Amendment) Order 2014

The Misuse of Drugs (Amendment No. 2) and Misuse of Drugs (Safe Custody) (Amendment) Regulations (Northern Ireland) 2014

- 1. Amendments to Misuse of Drugs legislation will come into operation during June 2014.
- 2. The above Order, became law on 10th June 2014 and, will bring a number of substances under the control of the Misuse of Drugs Act 1971. With respect to the substances used in medicine, lisdexamphetamine will become a Class B drug; ketamine will move to Class B (from Class C); tramadol, zopiclone and zaleplon will become Class C drugs.
- 3. In NI the above Regulations, due to come into force on 26th June, will add the substances mentioned in the Order to appropriate schedules in the Misuse of Drugs Regulations (Northern Ireland) 2002 ('the 2002 Regulations'). Lisdexamphetamine will be added to schedule 2. Tramadol will be added to schedule 3 while zopiclone and zaleplon will be added to schedule 4 Part 1. Ketamine is not being rescheduled at this point and will remain in schedule 4 Part 1.



- 4. Tramadol will be added to schedule 1 to the Misuse of Drugs (Safe Custody) (Northern Ireland) Regulations 1973, that is, those drugs which are exempted from the statutory secure storage requirements.
- 5. Lisdexamphetamine will be legally subject to the usual controls applied to schedule 2 drugs by the 2002 Regulations.
- 6. On the date that the Regulations come into operation, tramadol will be subject to the usual controls applied to schedule 3 drugs by the 2002 Regulations.
